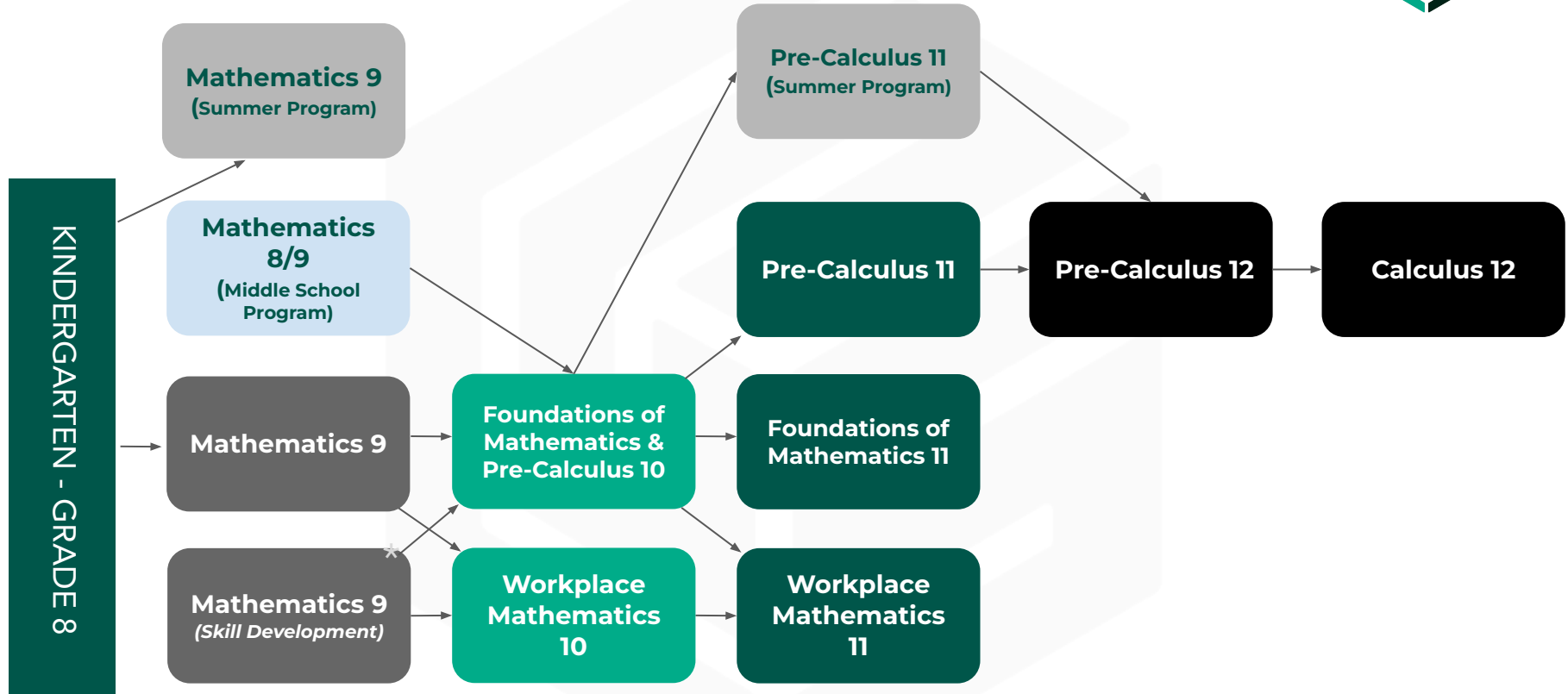

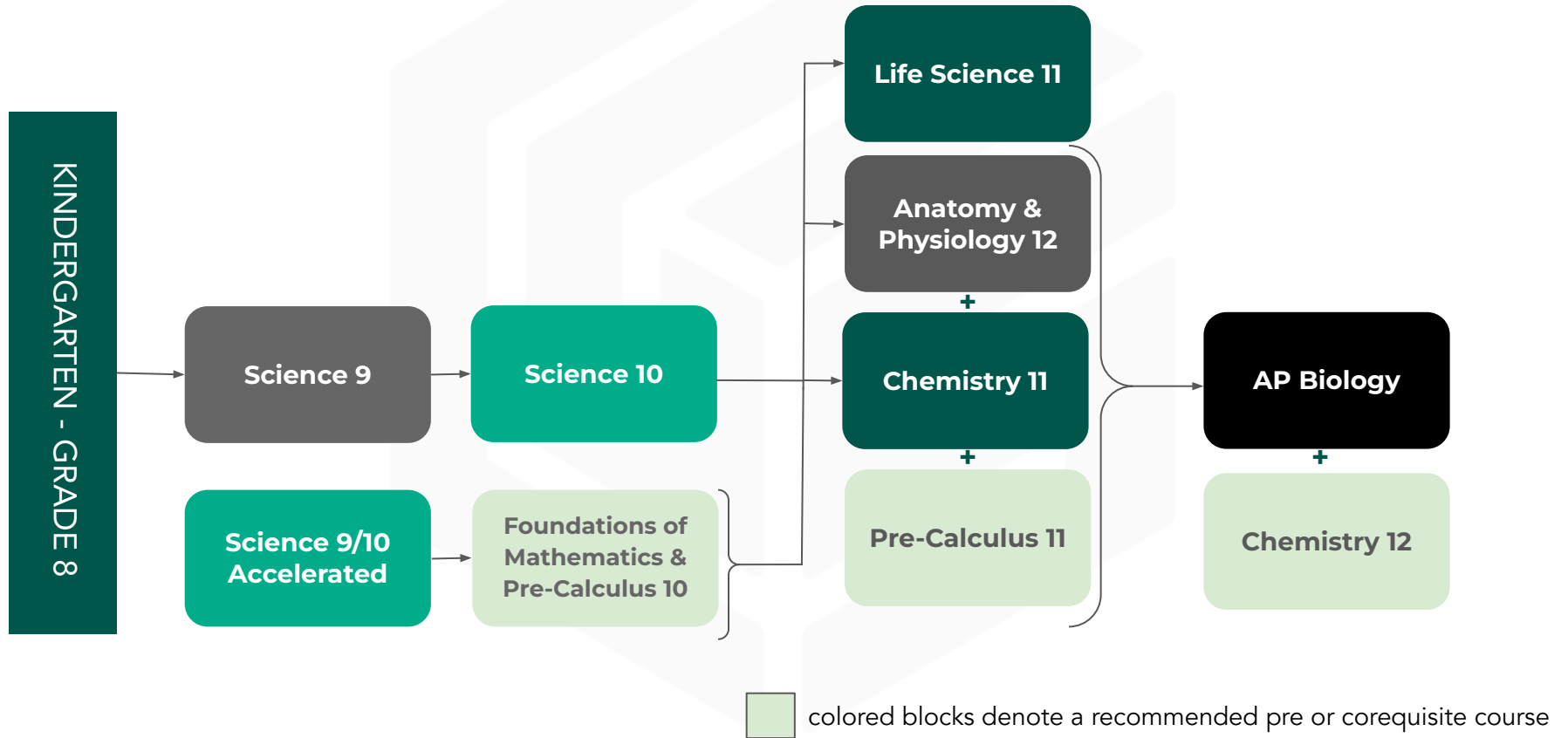

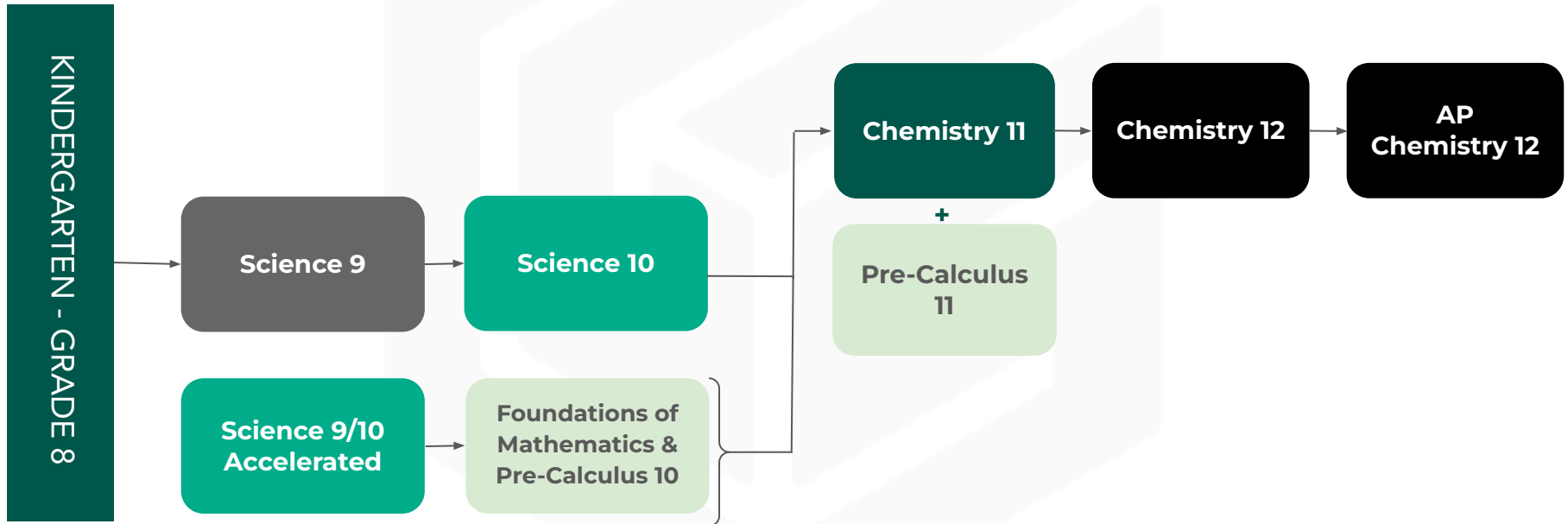

SCIENCE - BIOLOGY

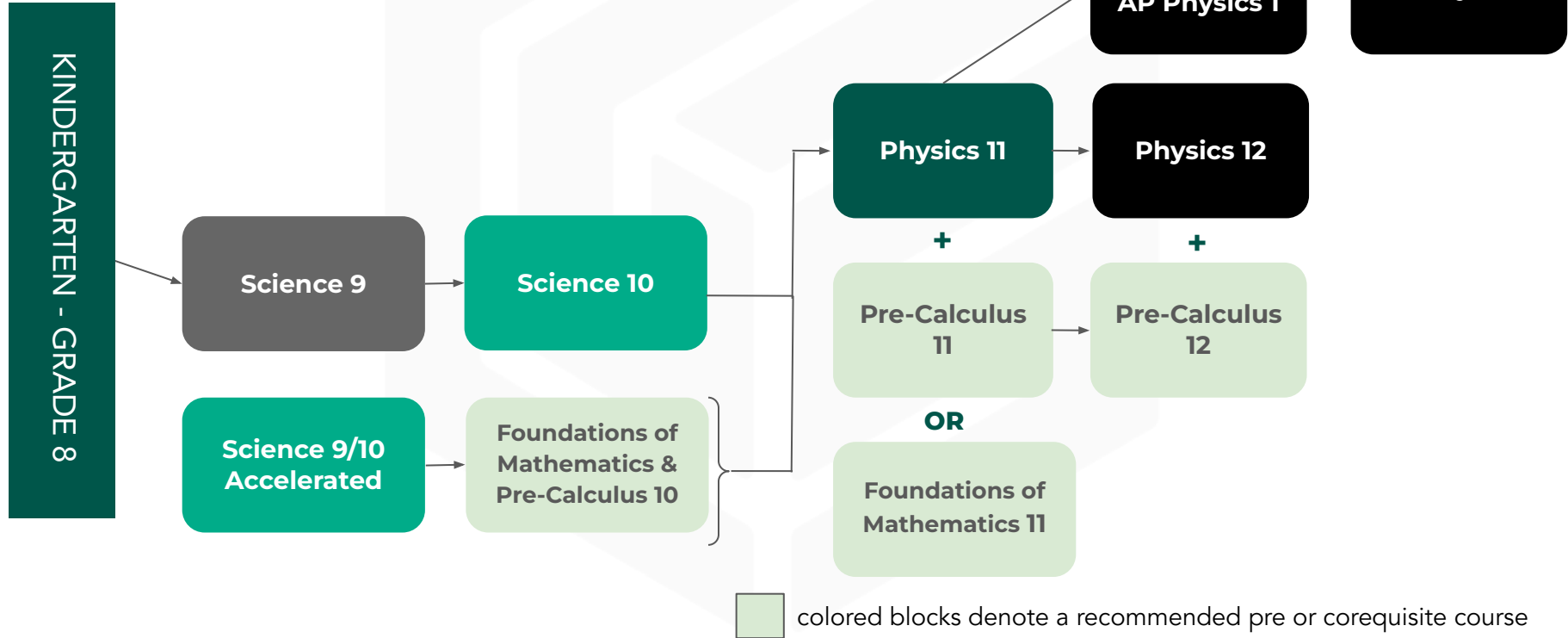


SCIENCE - CHEMISTRY

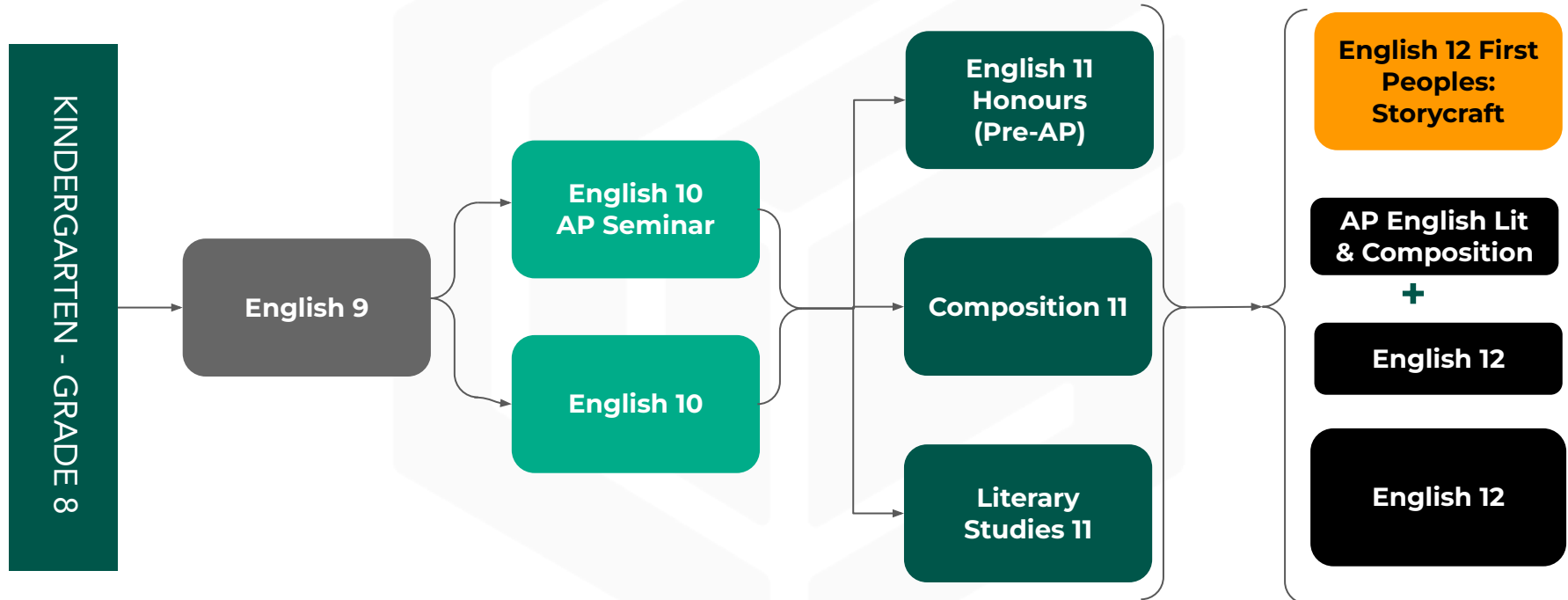

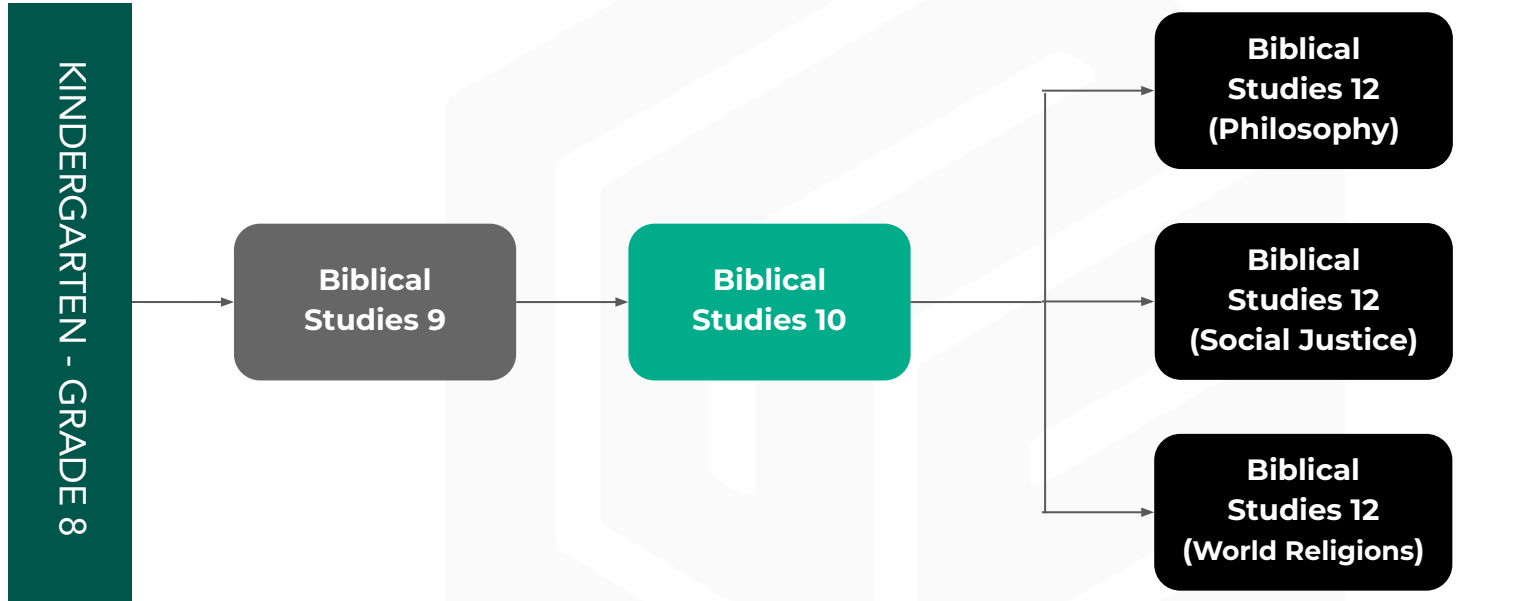

**Students with an elective course load of 7 courses are eligible to select English 12: First Peoples as an 8th course, to complete their English 12 and Indigenous Course Credits. 4 credits in an Indigenous focused course is a graduation requirement of the BC Ministry of Education and must be completed by all students at LCS (not online).

BIBLICAL STUDIES



* During Gr. 11 and Gr. 12, students must complete TWO of the three options provided for Biblical Studies 12. Typically, a student would enroll in one Gr. 12 course in their Gr. 11 year, and a second course in their Gr. 12 year. Students are permitted to enroll in all three Gr. 12 courses, or two in the same year.

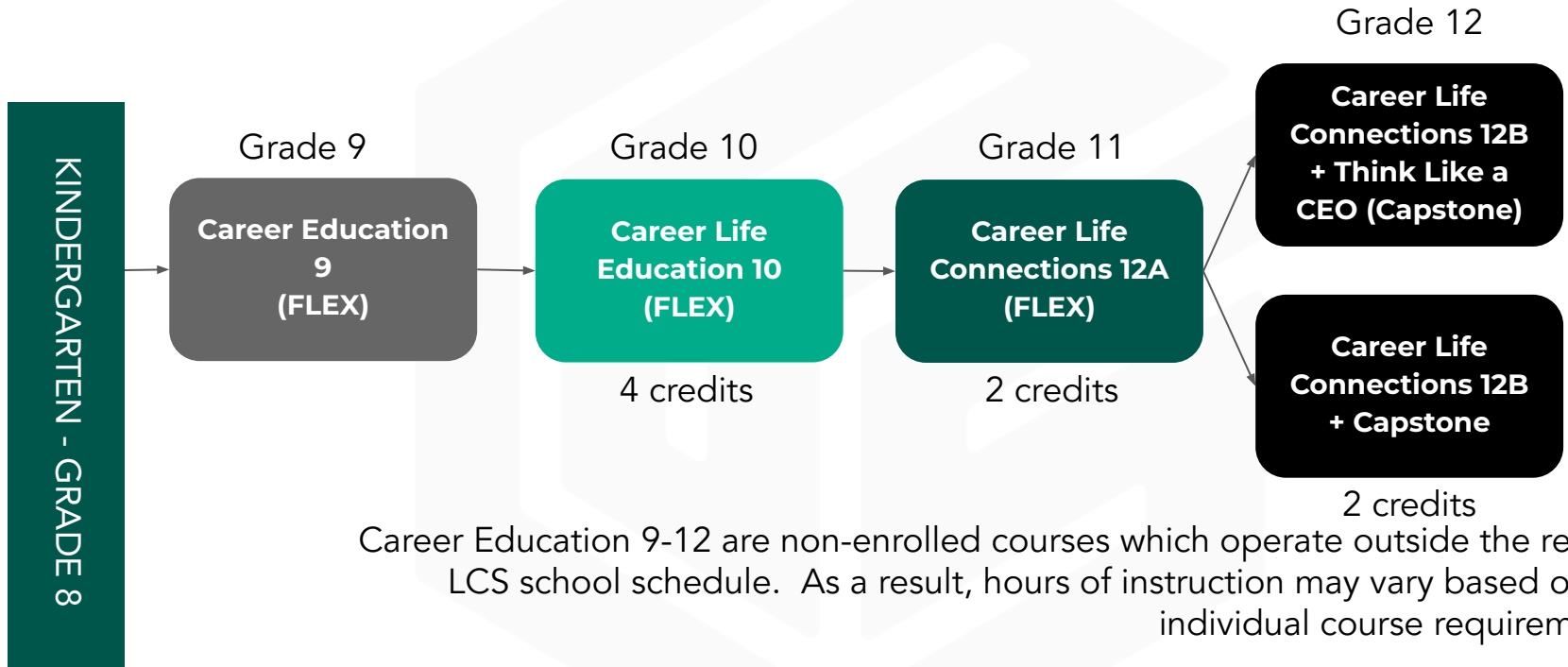


Second Languages & Post Secondary

In previous years, UBC and SFU required a second language 11 for admission to all their programs. This is no longer the case.

- Some post-secondary programs do require (or recommend) a second language 11.
- Some post-secondary programs require a second language for graduation (ie: Humanities degrees). It is recommended that students taking these degrees continue on with a second language in high school.
- If a student has an aptitude for languages, it can improve their overall academic average, resulting in a more solid admissions application or scholarship applications.
- Other benefits of taking a second language:
 - Improves your memory
 - Improves ability to multitask
 - Encourages cultural appreciation
 - Can make you a better communicator
 - Encourages creativity
 - Keeps your mind active

CAREER EDUCATION



Career Education 9-12 are non-enrolled courses which operate outside the regular LCS school schedule. As a result, hours of instruction may vary based on the individual course requirements.

CE 9, CLE 10 and CLC 12 take place during scheduled FLEX blocks. Attendance and completion are required as part of the BC Graduation Program.

Learning Services

✓ **Math 9 Skills Development**

Adapted Math 9 course spread over two semesters to provide additional time to complete core competency requirements.

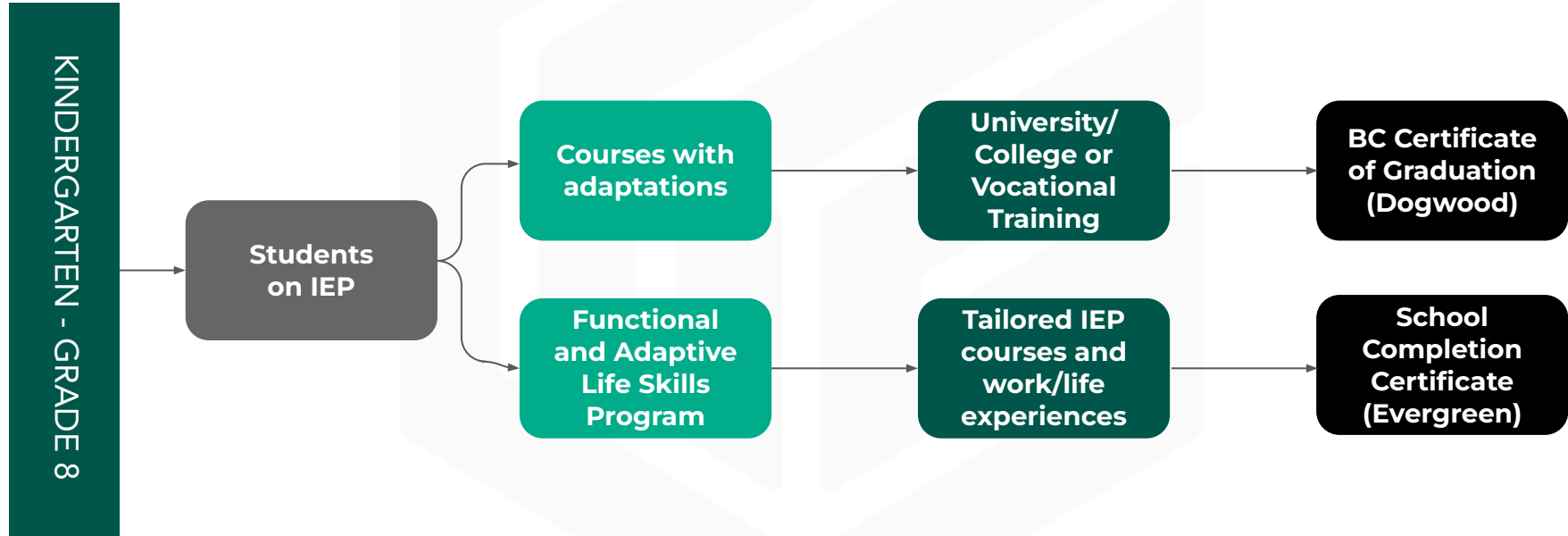
✓ **Student Support Blocks**

Students with an IEP who require additional time and support for assignment completion, executive functioning skills, and other adaptations.

✓ **Flex Blocks**

Provides small group learning assistance four times per week (160 minutes)

Approved Ministry of Education courses, programs, and assessments developed outside of the regular school system.

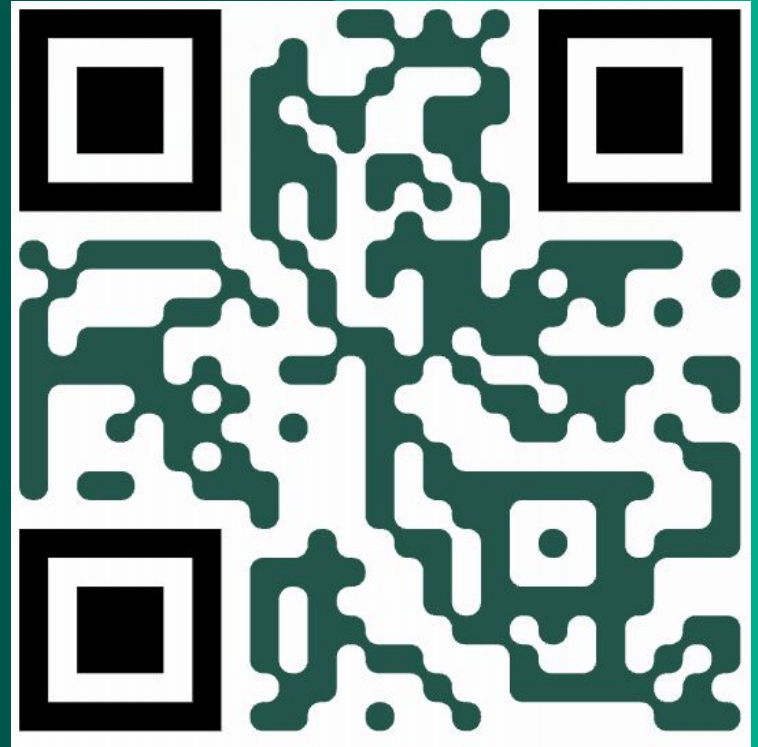

LEAP Requirements for Admittance

All: Excellent or Good work habits in all courses.

All: Participate in at least one LCS extra-curricular program during the school year.

Academics

- Maintain an extending level of proficiency in all courses.
- Enrolled in for-credit studies at the University/College level OR enrolled in at least 3 above-grade-level courses.

Athletics/Arts:

- Maintain a proficient level of proficiency in all courses.
- Compete or perform in the top 5% of provincial standards, or be enrolled in a provincial or Olympic/professional level program.
- Supervised training or performance for at least 1 hour per week over a 4 month period, or 1 hour per week over a 10 month period.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- Preparation for University workloads and content
- Increased admissions opportunities for Post Secondary institutions
- Potential University Credit (Exam Score of 3 or higher) - Exam \$165

Course Selection Process

February 2-6

- Grade 11 students will receive an email from their House Director for their appointment time.

February 9-12

- Grade 10 students will receive an email from their House Director for their appointment time.

February 17-20

- Grade 9 students will receive an email from their House Director for their appointment time.

February 23-27

- Current Grade 8 students will meet with House Directors during their library block.

NOTE: Students are encouraged to read through the Course Program Guide and talk to their parents/guardians before their House Director meeting.

Add/Drop Policy

Students have until the end of the first week of school to drop a course. This includes courses in any term (Linear or S1 or S2).

If a student has an extenuating circumstance, they may appeal to drop a course provided that they have completed an add/drop form. Signatures required on the form include:
