## Head of Schools Report to PAC #4

1. Less than \$1.8M left to raise to meet our middle school fundraising goal!
  - Every gift or pledge between now and May 1 is doubled. Two existing donors have offered to match every dollar raised this month.
  - Your one-time gift or pledge really matters. We are entering our final 100 days of the fundraising effort. The new school will be completed in July and we will need to know how much our final post-construction mortgage will be.
  - This is your last chance! 409 donors have raised \$11.7M so far and will be recognized on our donor appreciation wall in the new middle school. Our fundraising campaign will end this July, so if you've not made a commitment yet we really need your help. 2. We're nearing a final strategic plan draft that will guide to the school from now to 2030 when we celebrate 75 years of Christian education in Langley.
  - Thank you to all the parents who came out to provide feedback on our draft strategic plan earlier in the year.

- We have shared the new plan with each of our campuses and are getting closer to a final plan that will be unveiled at the May 25 Society Meeting.

### 3. Tuition Schedule Updating

- The LCS board finance committee is currently reviewing options to update our tuition fee schedule. Revisions are being considered for 2027 that will best reflect the demographics of LCS families and ensure long term sustainability and affordability. ### 4. Grade 6 class added for 2026-2027

- As we've shared at previous PAC meetings this year, LCS is adding a 5<sup>th</sup> grade 6 class to the new middle school this fall. A 5<sup>th</sup> class will raise the grade level cohort from approximately 100 students per grade in middle school, to 125 students per grade. This additional tuition and grant revenue will help cover costs associated with a new campus, including additional custodial and maintenance services. 100-125 students per grade is the "sweet spot" for school impact and community connection in North America.
